

WHAT TO WEAR

Please find below our suggested attire for each class

Ballet, Jazz & Contemporary:

- Leotard with tights and a ballet skirt or singlet/tshirt with bike pants
- Ballet/Jazz Shoes (no bare feet)
- Hair up and tidy

Hip Hop:

• Comfortable and appropriate shirt & pants that allow for full range of movement without anything flashing or peaking out.

Sneakers or runners suitable (no bare feet please)

Musical Theatre:

• Comfortable and appropriate shirt & pants that allow for full range of movement without anything flashing or peaking out.

- Ballet/Jazz Shoes (or sneakers, though proper dance shoes are preferred)
- Hair up and tidy

We will have themed dress up classes placed on the calendar so please encourage your performer to wait for those weeks to wear their special costumes.

EXPECTATION

Arrival at Class

Please wait with your child until the teacher opens the door for class. Please ensure your child has a water bottle for class, has been to the bathroom and is not hungry upon arrival. Parents are unable to enter the classroom during lessons.

Performer's Behaviour

We are proud and excited to provide your performer with teachers who have professional industry experience and training. The quality of our teachers allow your performer to grow and develop their giftings with quality and efficiency, however this requires your performer to treat our teaching artists and fellow creatives with the respect that they deserve. We ask that you sit down with your performer/s and run them through these expectations prior to their first class:

An Attitude of Investment: We do not require your performer to be doing triple pirouettes before they can take our classes [thats what we are here for], however, we do require them to understand that these classes are for learning in a safe and supportive environment.

• Respecting our Teaching Artists: This means being genuinely interested in what they have to say, as well as trusting their creative choices.

• Respecting our Fellow Creatives: We ask that your performer allows others to be able to talk and avoid touching another performer unless instructed by the teaching artist and "ok'd" by the other performer first.

Contact will be made with you if any serious concerns are brought up by our teaching artists and a meeting can be set up to see what can be done about potential issues.

Pickup from Class

All students must be picked up from class by a parent/guardian or authorised pickup person who is over the age of 16. Students will be instructed to wait inside the classroom if the parent is late to pick up their child. We understand emergencies happen, however if late pick up happens twice or more, there will be a charge of \$1 per minute.

FEES

\$40 annual enrolment fee per performer.

30 Minute Class - \$130 per term

45 minute class - \$140 per term

60 minute class - \$150 per term

10% discount on additional classes

10% sibling discount available

Invoices will be distributed at the commencement of each term.

• All fees are charged per term and are due by the end each school term.

Enrolment fee due upon initial enrolment.

 All payments are made online through credit card or direct debit. Payments are non-refundable.

 Please note: we are not able to credit classes or refund due to the performer being absent or unwell.

In the event the student does not provide CCA with full payment by the due date of invoice, the performer will not be permitted to participate in future terms.

 As per industry standard, performers will be required to pay for any costumes required for performances throughout the year. All efforts possible will be made to reduce this cost.

Students may change (or add) classes after enrolment in each term. Written notification of intention to change must be given to <u>cca@citipointechurch.com</u>.
Any difference in class fees must be paid at the time of notification before the change or added classes will be confirmed. Upon commencement of week 3 in each term and thereafter, no changes can be made to a performer's enrolment without prior written approval from management.

ABSENTEES

We understand that everyone can get sick from time to time. If this occurs we ask that you notify **cca@citipointechurch.com** if your child will be absent. Refunds are not offered for missed classes and make-up sessions are unfortunately not available.

Damages

The parent/guardian will be financially responsible for any damage sustained to CCA's property by the performer or their guardian. Management will charge the parent/guardian for any repairs, labour or replacement as deemed necessary.

Unforeseen circumstances

If CCA is unable to comply with any of the provisions of this agreement by virtue of any cessation or interruption of electricity or gas supplies, industrial disputes, plant or equipment failure, or any other unforeseen contingency or accident, CCA will not be liable.

Responsibility

CCA does not accept responsibility for the damage or loss of goods left on the premises prior to, during or after dance classes. The performer and their guardians are solely responsible for their personal belongings and property whilst on the premises. The student and their guardian release CCA staff, instructors, agents and directors from any responsibility in any way for loss or damage of its personal belongings or property. The performer and their guardian shall make no claim adversely impacting, causing hardship or undue stress on CCA as a result of their actions.

Duty of Care, Safety & Conduct

CCA provides for the safety and care of the performer whilst on the premises. CCA dance studios aim to take reasonable care to ensure their acts of omissions do not cause reasonably foreseeable injury to performers. Performers are responsible for their own conduct, behaviour and personal safety whilst on the premises. CCA does not accept responsibility for performer's safety outside the premises CCA and its service providers attempt to minimise any risk of personal injury within practical boundaries, however accidents do happen and all physical activities carry the risk of personal injury. All performers and guardians acknowledge that while every care and safety measures will be taken, there is an inherent risk of personal injury in physical activities that will be undertaken at the studio/as part of the program and accept that risk.

Media Consent

The performer and their guardian consent to release any photos and video footage obtained of the performer whilst in class or in performance for CCA, the performer and their guardian consent to the aforementioned photos and video footage to be used by CCA for the purpose of advertising, including, but not limited to citipointechurch.com, social media and www.youtube.com. Any photos or video footage obtained on the premises of citipointe creative academy remains the sole property of CCA. We ask that parents and guardians do not take a photograph or video footage of any classes or concerts in respect to the other members of the class. Instagram will be used to post class photos and where applicable photos from performances will also be sent through.
